




Our Core Functions




3 core functions at HQ/Call Centre with role champions

- Client Communication, Data Analytics, Client Services (distributed function run at all branches)




ARM IC CX Unit Structure






Call Center - IC

Mutual Funds



Mutual Funds are:

- •a pool of funds from a number of investors who have, relatively, the same investment objectives;
- •managed by professional fund managers
- •invested in various investment vehicles such as equities, bonds, real estate, money market securities
- •Allocation of funds to investment asset is at the discretion of the Fund Manager, who is guided by the fund's investment objective & risk profile
- •Investors are allocated units in a fund, corresponding to the value of their investment
- •Benefits of a mutual fund
 - •Professional fund management
 - Diversification
 - Affordability







- Objective to provide investors with capital growth in the long-term
- Moderate risk profile
- Listed on the Nigerian Stock Exchange
- Open ended Fund
- Has provided income through annual dividend payments
- Inception date: 1995
- Minimum investment: N10,000



ARM Aggressive Growth Fund

- Objective: to generate high, real returns over the long term
- High risk profile
- Open ended (easy entry & exit)
- Inception date: January 2005
- Minimum investment: N50,000





- •Objective: to generate high, real returns over the long term with strict compliance with moral and religious principle
- •Open ended fund
- •Diversification to spread risk
- •Minimum Investment N10,000.00



ARM Money Market Fund

- Objective: to provide a steady stream of income to investors by investing in high quality, short term money market instruments and government securities
- Low risk profile
- Open ended (easy entry & exit)
- Inception date: June 2013
- Minimum investment: N5,000



Guide to Making Product Recommendations



An ARM financial advisor must understand the prospective client in the light of the following factors:

- 1. Financial life cycle stage.
- 2. Goals
- 3. Liquidity Needs
- 4. Investment Horizon
- 5. Risk Appetite.
- 6. Risk Management Needs

The products we sell must be in line with the above. i.e. do not sell the aggressive growth fund to a client with a short term investment horizon or with a low risk appetite. The Money Market Fund will be more suitable for such a client.

It is our responsibility to educate the client on each of the 5 factors listed above.


Illustration: Financial Life Cycle and Needs Assessment





✓ Securities Trading

Buying and selling of shares of quoted companies on the Nigerian Stock Exchange (NSE)

✓ Certificate Dematerialization & Administration

Share Certificates are converted to electronic forms before the units they represent could be traded. This process is called dematerialization. ✓ Dividend Revalidation

Revalidation is the extension of the validity period of a stale (not converted to cash within six months of issue) dividend warrant. ARM Securities liaises with the relevant registrars to revalidate dividend warrants on behalf of clients that were unable to cash their dividend warrants within the validity period.

✓ Securities Transfer

Transfer of existing securities from other brokerage firms.

✓Primary Market Distribution

Provision of access to public offers and rights issues.
