Weekly Commentary & Stock recommendation

Global Economy

• The Eurozone experienced its fourth consecutive month of deflation as consumer prices declined by 0.3%YoY in November (October: -0.3%YoY) according to a flash estimate. Prices slowed further for energy products (-8.4%YoY) and non-energy industrial goods (-0.3%YoY). Still in the Eurozone, unemployment in the region edged down marginally by 10bpsMoM to 8.4% in October, moving further away from an over two-year high of 8.7% recorded back in July. Over in the U.S, Thursday's Labor Department report revealed a decline in initial jobless claims to 712,000 from 787,000 in the week ended Nov. 28th. Despite the decline, initial claims remained well above pre-pandemic levels amid rising covid-19 cases and delay in additional fiscal stimulus. Elsewhere, China's manufacturing and non-manufacturing PMI both rose to nine-month high figures of 52.1pts and 56.4pts respectively as the world's second largest economy maintained an impressive rate of recovery from covid-19 induced disruptions. In other news, the UK became the first country in the world to approve the Pfizer/BioNTech coronavirus vaccine, paving the way for mass vaccination with the first 800,000 doses already on their way and due in the coming days.

Domestic Economy

This week, the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) in an effort the liberalize the receipt and administration of diaspora remittances in Nigeria revised the procedure for the receipt of diaspora remittances. Precisely, those beneficiaries of diaspora remittances are now given the option of receiving these funds via US dollars or into their ordinary domiciliary account. These changes are intended to deepen the FX market, provide more liquidity in the FX space and create more transparency in the administration of diaspora remittances in Nigeria. In addition, the CBN announced its plans to release excess above the required cash reserve requirements in form of special bills to deepen the financial market and avail the monetary authority with an additional liquidity management tool.

Equities and stock recommendation

- The Nigerian bourse maintained its positive trajectory for the second week in a row as NSE ASI advanced by 72bpsWoW to close at 35,137.99points while market cap printed at N18.4trillion. Significant gains in the Oil & Gas (+3.67%) and Telecom (+8.52%) sectors helped cap the losses recorded across Cement (-2.45%), Banking (-2.52%), Breweries (-6.50%) and Personal care (-5.61%),. Diving into the sectoral performance we observed that AIRTEL (+19.63%), MTN (+0.77%) and SEPLAT (+0.40%) WoW were the key drivers for the sustained upside. Conversely, declines were noted across NB (-7.05%), ZENITH (-2.04%), GUARANTY (-5.00%), BUA (-1.79%) and DANGCEM (-2.93%) WoW, amongst others.

Fixed Income

In the secondary market, the average fixed income yield was up 10bps WoW to close at 1.86% owing to increases at both ends of the curve. For context, the average bond yield experienced the more significant increase, printing up 16bps WoW to 3.58% spurred by expansions in Apr-2037 (+129bps), Apr-2029 (+78bps) and Jul-2030 (+60bps) while the average NTB yield edged up 3bps WoW to 0.13% following a marginal rise in the 91-day (+1bp) bill.



Trend in foreign exchange rates

Over the course of the week, the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) further depreciated the Naira following its upward review of its NGN/USD intervention rates to market participants. The move was premised on the need to further stem the demand for dollars amidst subdued foreign currency inflow owing to the pandemic-induced impact on crude oil prices and foreign portfolio investments. Also, the CBN amended its procedures for the receipt of diaspora remittances which now allows for either direct payment in foreign currencies to beneficiaries or transfer of such amount to their domiciliary accounts.
