## Weekly Commentary & Stock recommendation

... for the week 19 October - 23 October 2020



#### **Global Economy**

Preliminary PMI results in the eurozone for October point towards a further cutback in business activities. The composite PMI printed at 49.4 (September: 50.4), anchored by a contraction in services PMI to 46.2 (September: 48) while manufacturing PMI appreciated marginally to 54.4 (September: 53.7). A glance at individual countries revealed declines across Germany (from 54.7 to 54.5) and France (from 48.5 to 47.3), while composite PMI for the UK fell to 52.9 (from 56.5). Still in the UK, annual inflation rate was up 30bps to 0.5% YoY in September (August: 0.2%) after upticks in the cost of transport (-1% to 0.9%) and restaurant services (-2.8% to -0.7%). Elsewhere, final Q3 GDP estimates for China stood at 4.9% YoY (Q2: 3.2%), revealing a lower than expected expansion in economic activities (Estimate: 5.2%). However, there are signs that a state-backed industrial recovery is finally extending to consumption as Retail sales rose to an eight-month high of 3.3% YoY in September (August: 0.5%).

#### **Domestic Economy**

In a bid to increase patronization of local firms, the Federal government declared that contracts worth N5 billion and below would no longer be awarded to foreign firms in the country, but reserved exclusively for indigenous firms or companies for bidding, award and execution. Elsewhere, the IMF stated it may review Nigeria's growth projection should the ongoing protest in the country linger, following its recent revision to Nigeria's GDP to -4.3% in FY 2020 (previously: -5.4%). Meanwhile, the CBN published guidelines for accessing funding for the mass metering programme recently announced by the federal government in a bid to close the 10 million metering gap across the country. The objective of the scheme includes accelerating Nigeria's metering rate, eliminating arbitrary estimated billing as well as increase the local meter manufacturing, assembly, and deployment capacity. Notably, the apex bank prohibited the importation of fully assembled meters and other infrastructures that are already produced locally.

#### Equities and stock recommendation

- The bullish trend in the Nigerian bourse continued as the NSE ASI closed positive for the fifth consecutive week, advancing marginally by 13bps WoW. The ASI ended the week at 28,697.06 points, ٠ while market cap printed at N14.9 trillion. Gains in the Breweries (+5.41%), Food (+0.41%) and cement (+0.30%) sectors outweighed losses recorded across personal care (-2.08%), oil & gas (-1.98%), banking (-0.97%) and construction (-0.60%). Dissecting the sectoral performance revealed the major drivers for the upside were seen in INTBREW (+18.20%), NB (+5.69%), CONOIL (+9.72%), FLOURMILL (+6.24%), NASCON (+10.00%) and STANBIC (+2.33%) WoW, amongst others. On the other hand, declines were observed in ETERNA (-8.98%), CADBURY (-6.83%), WAPCO (-5.04%) and GUINNESS (-5.34%) WoW, amongst others.

#### Fixed Income

At the bond auction, the DMO offered N30 billion across 2 instruments - March-2035 and July-2045 - and received total subscription of N235.87 billion. Total sales came in at N50billion while the average stop rate for these two instruments was 5.49%, down from 8.71% at the last auction. Meanwhile, in the secondary market, the average fixed income yield ended the week 69bps lower to 2.16% owing to contractions at both ends of the curve. Both the average bond yield and the average NTB yield shed 70bps WoW to close at 3.89% and 0.42% respectively.



#### **China GDP**

Data relased this week showed that China's GDP grew by 4.9% YoY in the third quarter of this year. Although this growth was below analysts' expectations it still represented a sharp turnaround from the historic 6.8% decline at the start of the year. While China's economy has recovered quickly and growing again, the IMF still expects a negative global growth rate of 4.4% for FY 2020.
