Full Year Earnings Report

12 months ended 31st December, 2012

#### Recommendation: BUY

- Diamond Bank reported 27% YoY growth in turnover to N136bn for the 12 months to December 2012. PBT and PAT came in at N27.5bn and N22.1bn compared to respective losses of N18bn and N13.9bn in FY 2011.
- Gross earnings were 6% below our estimates while PBT was 9% behind on slightly higher opex and weaker non-interest income. However, PAT was 5% ahead due to a 10ppt discrepancy in effective tax rates.

# Revenue growth falters as NIR falls short on derivative losses

Diamond's gross earnings contracted 26% QoQ to N26.6bn breaking an 8-quarter rising trend. Noninterest revenue (NIR) which fell 70% QoQ and was 73% short of our estimates was primarily responsible for the weakness in the top-line as Diamond reported a N5.6bn loss on derivative instruments in Q4 12, worsened by a N1.2bn loss in the trading income line in contrast to the broad trend of trading gains in FY 12 results. Thus, while fee income (+65% QoQ) and other operating income items showed expected growth, the overall rising NIR trend in 2012 was halted largely due to the derivative losses which accounted for 82% of the Q4 shortfall in NIR relative to our estimates. Interest income (-34% QoQ to N24bn) also decelerated more rapidly than we estimated (-27% QoQ) owing to 11.8% asset yields being 40bps below our estimate.

#### Higher costs drive Q4 operational loss

- Interest expense rose 17% QoQ in line with a similar magnitude rise in funding base and reflects Diamond's continued ability to mobilize deposits in a cost-effective manner. The rise in deposits to N901bn was faster than we envisaged (FY12E N806bn), nevertheless interest expense still fell 24% short of our forecasts. It would appear that the industry –wide competition for funds we anticipated on expected proliferation of essentially the same structure as Diamond's Savings Xtra platform, which has been Diamond's primary vehicle for raising cheap deposits, did not have as adverse an impact as envisaged. Consequently, FY 2012 WACF moderated 20bps from 9M to 2.3% versus our expectation for a 30bps rise to 2.8%.
- Operating expenses surged 23% QoQ to N21.7bn, driven by personnel expenses which rose 35% QoQ while other operating expense items jointly declined 3% QoQ. Opex was 13% ahead of our estimates.
- The jumps in interest expense and opex amid lower revenues drove a N2.1 bn operating loss for Q4 12 (CIR: 111%) and bumped up FY CIR 11ppt from 9M levels to 61% (FY12E 55%).

#### Write-backs mark a turnaround in provisioning

- Halting 11 straight quarters of substantial provisioning, Diamond booked a N6.4bn write-back in Q4 12. Whilst management reports NPL ratio halved YoY to 4.7%, we note that this is largely a result of rapid growth in loans (+72% YoY) as actual NPLs declined a more moderate 27% YoY to N29bn. We thus believe the charge likely reflects strong recovery on a single exposure as opposed to broad based progress in resolving legacy issues.
- Nevertheless, the write-back compensated for the operating loss and helped Diamond book N4.3bn PBT (39% below our estimates) while PAT of N3.9bn was 33% ahead of our estimates which incorporated a 30% FY212E tax rate (in line with 9M average) vs 20% actual. PBT and PAT margins of 16% and 15% were respectively 400bps and 100bps below their 9M averages but still represent significant improvement on the 57% and 38% loss margins in FY 2011.

#### Longer term optimism supported by capital raising plans

- The absence of a dividend from Diamond (the only bank not to announce a FY dividend thus far) is in line with our expectations (0% payout ratio) which had been hinged on the need to conserve as much capital as necessary after the spate of provisions. Whilst Diamond's FY CAR of 17% is an improvement on H1 level of 12%, the announcement of a \$750million (~N120bn) capital raise underscores the need to replace lost reserves as well as an ambitious growth drive with loans rising 72% YoY (vs initial guidance of 40%). Furthermore, whilst details are as yet pending, the switch to IFRS and impending industry-wide Basel II adoption indicate there could be a significant Tier I capital component compared to a focus on dollar-based tier II capital as at H1 12. We believe this development could be significant for sustaining growth as from 2014.
- Based on modest asset yield deviation of 40bps below our estimate (the smallest of banks which have released with average downside of 105bps) we believe its retail asset segments provided the expected support to Diamond's yields. However, in cognizance of further yield declines, we have adopted a 50bps cut in 2013 asset yields although we have simultaneously increased our earning asset volumes in line with faster deposit growth than envisaged. Furthermore, we note weak interest Q4 NIR was exceptional and expect growth to resume in 2013 driven by fee income. We estimate Q1 2013 revenues rose 54% over a weak Q4 12 to N41bn with an overall forecast of N164bn for FY 13E.
- We expect the improvements in Diamond's funding costs to be sustained especially as the introduction of similar deposit generation schemes by some of its competitors has had little apparent effect on the success of its Savings Xtra product. Thus, we expect flat interest expense QoQ at ~N7bn with FY 2013 net interest margins steady at 80%, 300bps higher than previous.
- We have revised our CIR estimates 300bps higher to 58% to match the midpoint between our previous estimates and FY12 results, reflecting our belief that the Q4 jump could be a one-off. Notably, 9month CIR had been 500bps below our FY estimate before being skewed higher by a spike in Q4 13 opex. Accordingly, our Q1 13 opex is 8% lower QoQ in spite of upward revisions to ~N20bn.

- We have broadly discounted the Q4 write-back pending stronger confirmation that legacy issues are being fully resolved. In our view, the one positive quarter on this front does not outweigh recent history and we have maintained our cost of risk estimate at 2% for FY 2013.
- Our revisions have been relatively mild with FY 13E PBT flat from previous at N40bn while PAT is 5% higher, reflecting a cut in our tax rate to 20% and translates into EPS of N2.20.

### Not overly swayed by one weak quarter, we maintain BUY rating

• In spite of the weak Q4, we remain positive on Diamond's ability to sustain improvements in profitability driven by consistently low cost of funds. Our FY 2013 PBT and PAT estimates still imply 46% and 45% respective YoY growth. Reflecting cut back in discount rates and expectations for ~300bps higher PAT margins over our forecast horizon from current levels, our fair value estimate has increased 18% to **N10.1**. Diamond also trades at current PE of 4.1x and P/Bv of 0.9x compared to peer averages of 8.8x and 1.4x respectively while its forward PE of 3x compares with peer average of 6.6x. Coupling these valuation discounts with the 59% upside implied to our fair value estimate, we maintain a **BUY** rating on the stock.

#### ARM ratings and recommendations

ARM now employs a two-tier rating system which is based on systemic importance of the security under review and the deviation of our target price for the stock from current market price. We characterize systemic importance as a function of a stock's ranking among the group of top 20 stocks by NSE market capitalization over a trailing 6 month period (minimum) to the review date. We adopt a 5 point rating system for this category of stocks and a 3 point rating system for stocks outside this group. The choice of top 20 stocks arises from the consideration that this group of stocks constitutes >75% of overall market capitalization and stocks outside this group are generally less liquid and individually account for <<1% of market capitalization. For stocks in both categories, the basis for ratings subject to target price deviation is outlined below:
