

Stock report

Surprising YoY growth in revenue

Guinness Nigeria's Q1 2021 result revealed a pre-tax loss of ± 0.32 billion, an improved position from the loss of ± 0.37 billion reported in same period last year. The result was positive when compared to our estimates, stemming from higher than expected revenue as well as FX gains reported over the period. While we anticipated a QoQ improvement in sales, following the relaxation of the lockdown restrictions, the YoY improvement came as a surprise as the company implemented a price hike at the start of this calendar year. Over the review period, sales improved by 259% QoQ and 11.6% YoY to ± 30.02 billion.

- Higher costs lead to gross profit decline: A 46% YoY decline in export revenue to N0.37 billion means that the 11.6% YoY growth in overall revenue was driven solely by increased sales in Nigeria (+13%YoY). However, cost of sales rose 21.4% YoY (Q120: -0.2% YoY) to N23.01 billion which represents a faster rate of increase than the 11.6% rise in revenue. This translated to an 11.8% YoY decline in gross profit to N7.01 billion which gives a gross profit margin of 23.4% (Q120: 29.5%). Despite this lower gross profit, improved performances away from the topline meant that overall loss in Q121 was lower than in Q120
- OPEX declined sharply by 10.2% YoY (Q120: -3.4%YoY) to N6.63 billion led by falls in both admin costs (-7.9% YoY) and sales & distribution costs (-11.1% YoY). Combining that with other income of N0.21 billion gives us an EBIT of N0.59 billion, a 14% decline compared to the same period last year. EBIT margin is slightly lower at 2.0% compared to the 2.5% in Q120.
- Net finance cost declined by 14.1% YoY (Q120: +143.8%YoY) to N0.9 billion following a faster increase in finance income than finance costs. Finance income rose 96.9% led by a 132% rise in gains from FX re-measurement while finance costs rose 6.2%YoY. Though the company paid down its short-term debt to N13.28 billion (-42% QoQ), the FX losses booked on the \$23 million parent loan company drove the mild increase in finance cost.

- The balance sheet showed a 258% increase in cash to N18.88 billion between Q420 and Q121, which was driven by a 66% decline in trade receivables to N6.27 billion, the lowest we have seen it since 2013. This is in line with the policy announced last quarter of improving their credit risk, in particular we saw the amount due from related parties decline by 97%QoQ.
- **Buy recommendation maintained:** The performance this past quarter has increased optimism for FY21. However, the current unrest across Nigeria and the re-imposition of restrictions in advanced economies could affect sales over the upcoming festive period. on that note, we cautiously increased our overall revenue projections for FY21 based on higher domestic sales with exports coming in flat for the year. As a result we have raised our FVE rise by 15% to **N21.40** which, based on current market price, represents a **BUY** rating.

ARM ratings and recommendations

ARM now employs a two-tier rating system which is based on systemic importance of the security under review and the deviation of our target price for the stock from current market price. We characterize systemic importance as a function of a stock's ranking among the group of top 20 stocks by NSE market capitalization over a trailing 6-month period (minimum) to the review date. We adopt a 5-point rating system for this category of stocks and a 3-point rating system for stocks outside this group. The choice of top 20 stocks arises from the consideration that this group of stocks constitutes >75% of overall market capitalization and stocks outside this group are generally less liquid and individually account for <<1% of market capitalization. For stocks in both categories, the basis for ratings subject to target price deviation is outlined below:
