## Operating efficiency revamps earnings

(SELL: N57.60)

- Guinness Nigeria Plc (Guinness) released its audited FY 17 results, which revealed a post-tax profit of ¥1.9 billion (FY 16: ¥2.0 billion loss). The marked turnaround in performance majorly stemmed from belt tightening measures and price-induced growth in top-line.
- In view of this the improved performance, Guinness raised its dividend per share by 28% YoY to ₩0.64, which translate to a dividend yield of 0.7% based on current pricing.
- Going into FY18, we expect Guinness' margins to remain at subdued levels as depressed real income levels drives further dominance of value beers in top-line. That said, the combined effect of a relatively stable NGN outlook, which limits scope for further FX losses, price induced growth to top-line as well as continued cost containment bodes well for earnings recovery from the low base of 2017. Irrespective, owing the dilutive impact of its planned rights¹ (46% of current shares outstanding), we reiterate our SELL rating on the company's stock.

#### Cost containment buoys operating performance

- Going through the finer details, cost containment measures were central to Guinness' earnings rebound as management reined in OPEX (+2.9% YoY to N39 billion) by reducing staff headcount (-29% YoY to 951) and kept S&D cost (+2% YoY) in check. According to Guinness management, the company's marketing efforts were only focused on the Satzenbrau and mainstream spirits launches. Against this backdrop, OPEX-sales ratio fell 6pps YoY to a three-year low of 37% over the financial year.
- Supporting the operational efficiency is the strong top-line, which rose at its fastest pace in eight years (+23.5% YoY) to a record high of N125.9 billion. The upsurge in turnover largely reflected price hikes as the company, in a bid to pass-on inflationary pressures to consumers, raised prices of its products (+30%-35% YoY across most of its portfolio). As in prior years, consumer downtrading from premium and mainstream products remained prevalent with management attributing most of top-line growth to higher sales of value brands, with Satzenbrau (+61% YoY) and Dubic Malt leading the top-line improvement. Consequently, Guinness reported a more than two-fold YoY growth in EBIT to №10.2 billion with related margin expanding 3.8pps YoY to 8.1%.

### Earnings defy subsisting cost pressures

Despite the impressive operating performance, there were noteworthy pressures. First was the elevated input cost. Over FY 17, Guinness reported a 29% YoY—faster than revenue growth—rise in COGS to \$\frac{1}{2}7.6\$ billion. Sifting the breakdown provided, we isolate the upsurge in COGS to elevated raw material cost (\$\pmu43\%\$ YoY to \$\frac{1}{2}53.4\$ billion) following uptrend in the cost of key domestic inputs (YoY: Sorghum: \$\pmu109\%\$, Refined sugar: \$\pmu90.5\%\$) as well as impact of naira weakness (FY 17 mean FX rate: \$\pmu37\%\$ YoY to \$\frac{1}{2}32.24/\$) on imports. Second was the higher finance cost which tracked movement in borrowings (\$\pmu7\%\$ YoY to \$\frac{1}{2}41.9\$ billion) and interest rate in the domestic environment. Particularly, reflecting CBN's ongoing monetary tightening which has pushed the naira yield curve 9.6pps higher YoY to 20.7\%, the effective interest rate on Guinness' debt climbed 300bps. Nevertheless, gains from cost control as well as revenue growth drove a rebound in PAT to \$\frac{1}{2}1.9\$ billion (FY 16 loss after tax: \$\frac{1}{2}2\$ billion).




Figure 2: Historical effective interest rate and borrowings(№'000)

#### Potential share dilution leaves SELL rating unchanged

- Going into FY 2018, we expect top-line to continue to benefit from price hikes as management remain resolute in passing on input cost pressures to consumers. However, given the potential impact of price increases on the already weak consumer discretionary income, we see scope for volume contraction. Overall, we project a slower rise (9% YoY to ¥137.3 billion) in FY 18 sales, relative to the prior year.
- On cost, subsisting supply shocks (higher transport cost, and flood in key agricultural regions) should drive cost of local raw materials higher. This should trump impact of naira gains on the cost of imported inputs (imports-COGS ratio: 25% over 2017). Against this backdrop, we expect an 8% YoY rise in COGS to drive gross profit to \$\frac{\text{N}}{2}53.6\$ billion (+11% YoY).
- Elsewhere, though Guinness has an outstanding net short FCY position on dollar-denominated loans of \$95 million from parent Diageo (\$22 million utilized as at FY 17), planned repayment of the foreign debt and expected stability in FX market dampens prospect for FX loss. As a result, we estimate a 69% YoY contraction in borrowing cost to \$\frac{\textbf{N}}{3}\$.0 billion.
- Akin to FY 17, we expect Guinness to maintain its ongoing stance of reining S&D in line with management guidance which should result in modest OPEX growth (FY 18E: +4.6% YoY to ₹40.8 billion). Net impact of our adjustments translates to PBT and PAT of ₹12.6 billion (+3.7x YoY) and ₹8.7 billion (+3.6x YoY) respectively over FY 18E.
- Despite the upbeat earnings outlook, Guinness' plan of raising №39.7 billion capital through rights should raise the company's shares outstanding to 2.2 billion shares (+46% from current levels). Given the significant interest trailing the rights, which closed on the 30<sup>th</sup> of August, we are of the view that the rights would have been fully subscribed and have therefore factored it into our model. Against this backdrop, our FY 18 EPS for the company would print at №3.94 (excluding dilution: №5.8). On current pricing, Guinness trades at a forward

#### ARM ratings and recommendations

ARM now employs a two-tier rating system which is based on systemic importance of the security under review and the deviation of our target price for the stock from current market price. We characterize systemic importance as a function of a stock's ranking among the group of top 20 stocks by NSE market capitalization over a trailing 6-month period (minimum) to the review date. We adopt a 5-point rating system for this category of stocks and a 3 point rating system for stocks outside this group. The choice of top 20 stocks arises from the consideration that this group of stocks constitutes >75% of overall market capitalization and stocks outside this group are generally less liquid and individually account for <<1% of market capitalization. For stocks in both categories, the basis for ratings subject to target price deviation is outlined below:
