Initial View

Decent result despite few surprises

- Fidelity Bank released audited H1 19 result this morning, recording PBT and PAT growth of 15.7% YoY and 15.6% YoY. Both PBT and PAT, are slightly ahead of our estimate with 54% run-rate of our full year estimate. The bank recorded a net write back of N768 million over H1 19 following a restructuring that resulted in significant change of the cash flows of the asset. Consequently, a write back of N4.0 billion was recorded while derecognition loss of N4.7 billion was booked in the same manner. Excluding this asset, the bank booked a further write back of N6.4 billion and impairment charge of N4.6 billion on Stage 2 and 3 loans. Another surprise for us, was the movement on the interest expense line, which expanded 16.5% YoY to N48.9 billion. The increase emanated from higher term deposits (+62% YTD to N278.7 billion), with related CASA ratio moderating 7.9 pps YTD to 73.7%.
- Quarterly breakdown showed a similar descent performance with PAT increasing 30.4% QoQ to N7.7 billion largely driven by improved net interest margin and loan write-backs of N1.8 billion (Q1 19: Loan loss provision N1.0 billion). Our estimated NIM showed a modest improvement (+120 bps QoQ) mirroring a faster increase in asset yield (+150 bps QoQ). Not surprising, interest income from customer loans advanced 26% YoY to N60.3 billion reflecting an increased loan book (+16% YTD).
- Other key highlights of the result were moderation in NPL ratio (-30 bps to 5.4%), largely reflecting an increased loan book. We however note our concern on the growth in absolute NPL (+9.7% YTD). Loan to deposit ratio and CAR of 96% and 17% printed well above the regulatory requirement of 60% and 15% respectively. We also observed a jump in the bank's fair value reserve (+145% YTD) which provided support to CAR over the period. We will be seeking further clarity from management.

- The stock currently trades at a current P/B of 0.24x which is at a premium to FCMB of 0.17x. Our last communicated FVE on FIDELITY is ₦2.9 which translates to a BUY rating on the stock. We will revisit our numbers after further discussion with management.

Summary of Results

ARM ratings and recommendations

ARM now employs a two-tier rating system which is based on systemic importance of the security under review and the deviation of our target price for the stock from current market price. We characterize systemic importance as a function of a stock's ranking among the group of top 20 stocks by NSE market capitalization over a trailing 6-month period (minimum) to the review date. We adopt a 5-point rating system for this category of stocks and a 3-point rating system for stocks outside this group. The choice of top 20 stocks arises from the consideration that this group of stocks constitutes >75% of overall market capitalization and stocks outside this group are generally less liquid and individually account for <<1% of market capitalization. For stocks in both categories, the basis for ratings subject to target price deviation is outlined below:
