Initial View

9 months ended 30th September, 2014

#### Recommendation: STRONG BUY

Guaranty Trust Bank Plc (GTB) reported results for 9 months to September 2014 wherein revenues rose 9% YoY to №198 billion. PBT came in 2% weaker YoY (6M: -7% YoY) at №80.7 billion while PAT was 4% lower YoY (6M: -10% YoY) at №66.7 billion. YoY, Q3 14 Revenues, PBT and PAT all matched our estimates.

# NIR abates top-line pressure as asset growth stagnation persists

retraced all the improvement in Q2 with a 10bps decline in asset yields being primarily responsible. The changes within a flat earning asset base were a rotation out of cash (-24% QoQ) and securities (-9% QoQ) into loans (+12% QoQ) which probably helped limit yield pressures. Relative to our estimates, a lack of volume growth underpinned a 4% shortfall in interest income. In contrast, non-interest revenue rebounded stronger than expected—16% above estimates—to \$\frac{\text{\t

#### Lower impairments midwife QoQ rise in profits

- Repeating the earning asset pattern, funding base was also flat QoQ at ¥1.8 trillion with associated interest expense up 2% QoQ to ¥14.7 billion. Nonetheless, the mild rise evinces no concerns regarding funding costs with annualized WACF unchanged from 6M 14 at 3.1%. However, interest expense outcome was in contrast to our expectations for moderation, being 8% above forecast.
- Operating expenses for GTB rose 6% QoQ (Q2: -10% QoQ) to №22.8 billion, 2% below our estimates. With general & admin. expenses (-21%) and depreciation. & amortization (-14%) both down QoQ and personnel expense flat QoQ at №6.9 billion, the 53% rise in 'other opex' was the primary driver of the QoQ increase and pinpoints regulatory costs as a significant dampener still. Regardless of the increase, annualized cost to income ratio was up a modest 20bps QoQ to match our 44% FY 14 estimate.
- After marking a 3-year peak in quarterly charges in Q2 14, provisioning contracted 69% QoQ to ¥1.2 billion which is in line with our expectations that the prior surge was unlikely to be of enduring concern. Nonetheless, the decline was stronger than expected being 44% short of our estimates. Annualized cost of risk remains in line to match our FY 14 estimate of 0.8%.
- From operating profits being at par with prior quarter, lower impairments anchored the 8% QoQ rise in PBT to \$\frac{\textbf{N}}{27.3}\$ billion with PAT 9% higher QoQ at \$\frac{\textbf{N}}{22.7}\$ billion. Similarly, relative to our estimates, lower impairments was primarily responsible for making up the 2% deficit at operating profit level to ensure parity at PBT and PAT. Corresponding 9M 14 PBT and PAT margins at 41% and 34% are each 100bps ahead of 6M 14 levels but each 400bps lower YoY.

#### Price pressures on unchanged FVE open up upside

 Despite recovery in revenue in Q3 14, we think industry constraints to top-line growth remain significant and do not expect a major breakout beyond current level in Q4 14.
We continue to expect operating efficiency to remain strong and despite the muted provisions think that recent loan growth could again spur further charges. In all, with

#### ARM ratings and recommendations

ARM now employs a two-tier rating system which is based on systemic importance of the security under review and the deviation of our target price for the stock from current market price. We characterize systemic importance as a function of a stock's ranking among the group of top 20 stocks by NSE market capitalization over a trailing 6 month period (minimum) to the review date. We adopt a 5 point rating system for this category of stocks and a 3 point rating system for stocks outside this group. The choice of top 20 stocks arises from the consideration that this group of stocks constitutes >75% of overall market capitalization and stocks outside this group are generally less liquid and individually account for <<1% of market capitalization. For stocks in both categories, the basis for ratings subject to target price deviation is outlined below:
