

#### Initial View

#### Recommendation: NEUTRAL (N46.83)

- UAC of Nigeria Plc (UACN) released audited results for 12 months ending 31st December 2014 wherein revenues rose 8.8% YoY to N85.7 billion. PBT over the period was flat (+0.9%) at N14.1billion, while PAT gained 8.3% YoY to N10.7billion.
- UACN also announced a 175 kobo dividend per share which implies a payout ratio of 51.5% (FY 13: 60%) and a yield of 4.4% using its last trading price.

# Surge in UPDC revenue underpins group top-line growth

Revenue rebounded in Q4 14 (Q3 14: -10.6% YoY) rising 34.4% YoY to ¥25.1 billion--- 3% higher than our forecasts. Disaggregating the sub-components, sales expansion largely stemmed from upswing at listed real estate subsidiary UACN Property Development Company (UPDC) which nearly tripled YoY to ¥3.5 billion aided by gains from other listed companies such as Livestock Feeds (+37% YoY to ¥2.5 billion), Chemical and Allied Paints (8.4% YoY to ¥1.9 billion) and Portland Paints (+6% YoY to ¥748 million). Top-line growth also received a boost from its ex-listed subsidiaries (which comprise Grand Cereals Limited, UAC Foods, UAC Restaurants and MDS Logistics) where sales rose 25.4% YoY to ¥16.5 billion. Over 2014, top-line gains largely reflected increased volumes particularly in the animal feeds category (where its vital fish is now the market leader at



16% share) as well as commissioning of a new 12 MT/Hour Ikeja mill in June 2014. The volume gains were supported by price increases across its paints business.

#### Spike in soybean prices drive margin contraction

- At ¥19.6 billion, Q4 14 COGS rose faster (+40.2% YoY) than revenues and our estimates (¥18.2 billion) resulting in gross margins shrinking 3.2pps YoY to 22% (Gross profits: +17.1% YoY to ¥5.5 billion). Management links up-thrust in input costs to 40% YoY climb in soybeans prices faced by GCL following disruptions to supply stemming from pastoral-farmer conflicts in the north central region during Q4. The higher soyabean prices offset impact of softer maize prices (-22% YoY) in Q4 14 using FEWSNET data.
- Opex rose 13.5% YoY to N2.2billion as UACN slowed down on its RTM expenditure resulting in opex-to-sales ratio shrinking 1.6pps to 8.6%. Nonetheless, the input costs pressures filtered through to EBIT with margins contracting 1.7pps YoY to 13.4% (EBIT: +19.5% YoY to N3.4 billion).

#### Profits from UPDC REIT powers earnings expansion

Notwithstanding an 87% contraction in finance costs reflecting UPDC's restructure of its debt from ST to LT borrowings, absence of finance income in the period (Q4 13: N1.7 billion) underpinned a net finance expense of N198.8 million in Q4 14 as against net finance income of N241.6 million in Q4 13. However, UACN recorded N2.98 billion as its share of associate company profits in Q4 14 (vs. Q4 13: nil), reflecting its 51.1% share in UPDC's REIT which recorded profit over 2014. The company stated that its lack of control of operational and financial activities of the REIT necessitated the associate classification. The associate's profit bolstered UACN's earnings with PBT and PAT rising 40.2% and 50.3% YoY to N7.3 billion and N6.1 billion respectively while corresponding margins expanded 1.2pps and 2.6pps YoY to 29.2% and 24.1% respectively.

## Robust outlook of agro-allied business and cost containment to offset concerns over UPDC

Going forward, heightened political activity and uncertainty following the change in government should drive slowdown in real estate activity which should impact UPDC. Indeed, management guides to potential headwind at its real estate division with mention of a strategic review. Nonetheless, pressures from UPDC should be tempered by UACN's agro-allied business, where recent capacity expansions on animal feed units amid favourable government policy disposition towards local agriculture should buoy outlook. Furthermore, management guidance to scale down on RTM expenditure should sustain top-line. However, we remain cautious over the sustainability of associate profits from UPDC given UACN's earlier guidance to moderate its stake in the REIT. Incorporating all of the foregoing concerns into our model and adjusting our discount rate to capture changes in sovereign yields results in a moderation in our FVE estimate to **N46.83**. UACN trades at current P/E of 11.77x vs. 22.86x for Bloomberg regional peers. The stock has gained 18% YTD with last trading price at a 17% discount to our FVE which translates to a **NEUTRAL** rating.

#### **ARM ratings and recommendations**

ARM now employs a two-tier rating system which is based on systemic importance of the security under review and the deviation of our target price for the stock from current market price. We characterize systemic importance as a function of a stock's ranking among the group of top 20 stocks by NSE market capitalization over a trailing 6 month period (minimum) to the review date. We adopt a 5 point rating system for this category of stocks and a 3 point rating system for stocks outside this group. The choice of top 20 stocks arises from the consideration that this group of stocks constitutes >75% of overall market capitalization and stocks outside this group are generally less liquid and individually account for <<1% of market capitalization. For stocks in both categories, the basis for ratings subject to target price deviation is outlined below:
