

Nigerian Breweries Plc. (NB.NL)

Initial View

Higher OPEX leads to steep profit decline

- Nigerian Breweries published their Q120 results late last night and it showed a 27.8% YoY decline in PBT to N8.28 billion which came despite the top lines of revenue and cost remaining almost unchanged with YoY growth of -0.1% and 0.2% respectively. Instead, the steep decline in profit was due to a sharp rise (14.1% YoY) in OPEX as well as increase in net interest expense (1.5% YoY).
- Revenue withstands late fall in volumes: In the conference call to discuss the FY19 result, management commented that they would be increasing prices in February to pass on the higher VAT to the consumer. The parent company, Heineken, commented in the Q120 results that the increase in price, coupled with a ban on the distribution of alcoholic drinks in some states, led to a "high single digit" decline in beer volumes in March. Nevertheless, Heineken confirmed that for the quarter as a whole volumes were broadly flat and this can explains the slight 0.1% decline in net revenue to №83.2 billion. Meanwhile, cost of sales rose 0.2% to №48.3 reflecting a 12% increase in depreciation and a 2% increase in amortization costs as raw material costs fell over the review period. Overall, gross profit was 0.5% lower at №34.87 billion with gross profit margin relatively flat at 41.9% (vs 42.1% in Q1 19).
- *Higher commercial spending leads OPEX higher:* On the aforementioned conference call, NB management made reference to the high commercial spending (S&D) and how they expected that to persist this year. Consequently, S&D, which makes up c.80% of OPEX, rose 13.5% YoY on the back of a 48% YoY jump in advertising. Admin costs, which makes up the other 20% of OPEX, was 16% higher YoY pushing OPEX up by 14.1% to ₹24.14 billion. A 15.4% YoY rise in other income was not enough to stop EBIT declining by 22.4% to ₹10.14 billion which translates to a contraction in related margin to 13.1% (vs 16.9% in Q119).
- Elsewhere, net finance costs rose by 1.5% YoY to №2.64 billion following the unenviable combination of a rise in finance costs (1.5%) and a fall in finance income (15.8%). Clearly, increased borrowings (119.8% YoY, 76.8% QoQ) led to an increase in finance cost. Overall, PBT was 27.8% lower at №8.28 billion while PAT fell by 31.4% to №5.51 billion.

- Looking at the balance sheet our attention is drawn to a 72.7% YoY increase in cash and cash equivalents to
 №24.58 billion, which largely reflects the proceeds from new borrowings. These borrowings included a №51.06 billion commercial paper and №22 billion revolving credit facility obtained from banks.
- Overall, we believe the ongoing national lockdown, which is expected to take a toll on revenue, the technical devaluation as well as disruption to supply logistics poses a downside risk to the company earnings over 2020. We will therefore revise our estimates which will be communicated soon and until then we are setting our recommendation as **NEUTRAL**.

ARM ratings and recommendations

ARM now employs a two-tier rating system which is based on systemic importance of the security under review and the deviation of our target price for the stock from current market price. We characterize systemic importance as a function of a stock's ranking among the group of top 20 stocks by NSE market capitalization over a trailing 6-month period (minimum) to the review date. We adopt a 5-point rating system for this category of stocks and a 3-point rating system for stocks outside this group. The choice of top 20 stocks arises from the consideration that this group of stocks constitutes >75% of overall market capitalization and stocks outside this group are generally less liquid and individually account for <<1% of market capitalization. For stocks in both categories, the basis for ratings subject to target price deviation is outlined below:
