

# Nestle Nigeria Plc. (NESTLE.NL)

## Stock Report

Higher costs continue to weigh on performance

- Nestle reported a 3.3% YoY growth in revenue to \$\frac{1}{2}71.7\$ billion for Q320, which is 1% higher than our estimate for the period. However, a faster rise in cost of sales of 8.5% YoY meant that gross profit declined by 3.5%YoY to \$\frac{1}{2}9.19\$ billion. And despite a decline in OPEX and net finance costs, the lower gross profit was enough to see PBT decline by 4.5%YoY to \$\frac{1}{2}5.4\$ billion (Q319: \$\frac{1}{2}6.12\$ billion). Over the 9M period, cost growth (+6.7%) also outweighed revenue growth (+0.7%) leading gross profit lower by 6.5% to \$\frac{1}{2}90\$ billion. PBT was 13% lower over the 9M at \$\frac{1}{2}49.26\$ billion (9M19: \$\frac{1}{2}56.55\$ billion) as OPEX (+1.5%) and net finance expense (+86%YoY) also rose. Nestle also announced an interim dividend of \$\frac{1}{2}5\$ per 50kobo ordinary share which is a dividend yield of 1.9%
- COGS rises again but at a slower pace: Q320's 3.3% YoY revenue growth was led by a higher beverages sales (+33%YoY) while food sales declined by 14% YoY. This is the opposite of what we saw in Q220. Going by our checks, while prices of items in the food segment remained flat YoY, we saw an increase in prices for items in the beverage segment. We therefore believe the outturn in the food segment mirrors a blend of both volume and price increase. Cost of sales, meanwhile, rose again this time by 8.5% YoY to N42.52 billion largely reflecting the impact of the FX devaluation which occurred earlier in the year. Gross profit printed at N29.19 billion which gives a gross profit margin of 40.7% (Q319: 43.5%).
- Sales and admin costs both declined by 0.9% and 7.3% respectively to bring overall OPEX down by 2.1% YoY to №13.33 billion. However, the lower top line meant that operating profit declined by 4.6% to №15.86 billion (Q319: №16.62 billion) leading to a slightly lower EBIT margin of 22.1% (from 23.9% in Q319). Despite the lower interest rate environment weighing on interest income on deposits (-0.75%YoY), a 119%YoY increase in FX gain from FCY balances led finance income higher by 24%. Finance cost was only 0.6% higher which meant that net finance cost declined 8.1% to №0.46 billion. Overall, PBT and PAT were 4.5% lower at №15.4 billion and №10.11 billion (Q319: №16.12 billion and №10.6 billion) respectively.
- Higher borrowings the standout balance sheet item: Between the end of Q220 and Q320 Nestle saw a huge increase in both short term and long term borrowings.
  Short term borrowings (including overdrafts) printed at N11.38 billion at the end of the

9M period from No.04 billion at the end of June while long term borrowing rose to N16.96 billion from No.81 billion. Payables declined 11% QoQ from a 7-year high of N106.4 billion to N94.55 billion, although this is still considerably higher than the 3-year historical averages of N62.4 billion.

• We maintain our FY20 revenue expectations for Nestle at ₹283.7 billion while still expecting gross margin to contract as costs weigh on revenue growth. We our FVE unchanged at ₹1288.63 with a NEUTRAL recommendation

### ARM ratings and recommendations

ARM now employs a two-tier rating system which is based on systemic importance of the security under review and the deviation of our target price for the stock from current market price. We characterize systemic importance as a function of a stock's ranking among the group of top 20 stocks by NSE market capitalization over a trailing 6-month period (minimum) to the review date. We adopt a 5-point rating system for this category of stocks and a 3-point rating system for stocks outside this group. The choice of top 20 stocks arises from the consideration that this group of stocks constitutes >75% of overall market capitalization and stocks outside this group are generally less liquid and individually account for <<1% of market capitalization. For stocks in both categories, the basis for ratings subject to target price deviation is outlined below:
