

Nigerian Breweries Plc. (NB.NL)

Stock report

Double whammy for volumes, downgrade to NEUTRAL Nigerian Breweries' (NB) parent company, Heineken, confirmed in its Q1 results that whilst beer volumes in Nigeria remained flat over the quarter, there was a 'high-single digit' decline in March. This decline resulted from NB's decision to increase prices in February following the VAT hike. These higher prices will be the first blow to NB's volumes over the year. The second, and more serious, blow will come from the lockdown implemented in late March and social-distancing measures put in place to combat the coronavirus. Volumes will be seriously hit by the ban on large gatherings, closed clubs and bars which are part of these combat measures. We fully expect a double-digit decline in Q2's volumes on the back of both factors, before a QoQ improvement in Q3 (but still a YoY decline). We forecast the sharpest YoY drop in revenue as a result. Reflecting this fall in revenue we have cut our FVE by over half (51.6%) to #36.69.

Sinking revenue to drag down Gross Profit: Over Q120, net revenue fell by an almost negligible 0.1% but looking ahead to FY20 we see revenue declining by 5.5% YoY to N305.24 billion, the lowest since 2014, on the back of the aforementioned factors. Q2 20 will experience the sharpest drop in revenue because of the lockdown that lasted all of April and the social-distancing measures that were put in place even after that ended. That coupled with the slowdown from higher prices means we can expect to see a double-digit decline for that quarter. Over FY we see costs rising by 1.9%, marking an end to two consecutive years of falling COGS, to N195.35 billion. Although this seems like a small rise, it would represent a cost to sales of 64%, which is comfortably their highest in the last decade. Although majority (~53%) of their raw materials is locally sourced, they still import a good amount of that (as well as spare parts and machinery) which means they are still exposed to the depreciating naira which, despite the mild decline in sorghum prices (-1.7% YTD), would lead to higher COGS. The combined effect of this is a 16.3%YoY crash in gross profit to N109.89 billion which translates to a gross profit margin of 36%.

- Considering the struggles we see the business facing over the year we see a slight decline in OPEX by 0.6% to ¥96.46 billion. After considering other income, EBIT for FY20, will print at ¥14.35 billion, giving us an EBIT margin of 4.7%. This marks a 59.2%YoY drop in EBIT and a drop in the EBIT margin from 11% in 2019.
- On the finance cost leg, NB's commercial papers so far this year have been borrowed at a lower weighted average interest rate of 7.45% (vs 13.89% in 2019). Lower interests will also be applied to their rolling loan facilities from the banks and from any other loans they take up during the course of the year. Based on those assumptions, we foresee less pressure on its finance costs. Combining all our assumptions, we believe the company will report PAT of ¥3.02 billion, an 81.3% decline from 2019.
- On our numbers, we downgrade NB to a **NEUTRAL** and cut our FVE by 51.6% to **N36.69** based on our expectation for lower sales.
