PZ Cussons Nigeria Plc. | Earnings Report Milder FX loss to flatter earnings

- PZ Cussons Nigeria Plc (PZ) released its financial statements for 12 months ended 31st May 2017, which revealed a 73% YoY growth in PAT to №3.7 billion that was largely underpinned by higher prices. The sturdy bottom-line occurred in-spite of an №8.8 billion (+205% YoY) FX loss reported over the period. Excluding the FX loss, PZ would have realized a PBT of №12.5 billion (nearly six-fold higher YoY). In any case, with earnings performance still reasonably upbeat, PZ left its dividend per share at №0.50 with implied dividend yield printing at 2% as at last market close.
- Interestingly, we expect the company's earnings momentum to subsist into FY 18 in view of sustained naira stability and price-induced top-line growth. Given the foregoing, we have upgraded our rating on the stock to a BUY with a FVE of N28.81.

Price hikes drive top-line growth

Over FY 17, PZ's revenue grew by a record 14.5% YoY to N79.6 billion largely reflecting the impact of price hikes across its product portfolio (YoY: Olympic Milk +55%, Zip +35%, Canoe +27%, Imperial Leather +29%). The price increases helped offset volume weaknesses, which was more pronounced in the white goods segment, amidst subsisting pressures on consumers discretionary income.




Figure 1: Historical Revenue growth (YoY) across PZ's operating segments

Sturdy top-line powers earnings

- However, the company endured input cost pressures in the review quarter with reported COGS printing 5% higher YoY (at N51.7 billion) despite the step-down in output. Specifically, the cost of raw materials rose by 9% YoY¹ to water down pass-through from lower personnel cost—an offshoot of production staff lay-off (-14% YoY to 888 people). Irrespective, knock-on effect from elevated prices across product portfolio saw the company report its fastest gross margin expansion in ten years (+6pps YoY to 35.1%).
- Despite reported belt tightening measures and a further reduction in staff (-7% YoY to 699 people), OPEX was also higher (+5% YoY). That said, aided by PZ's removal of FX loss from the COGS line—a segregation that began in FY 16—pass-through from price gains stoked a more than two-fold YoY jump in operating profit to ¥13.4 billion with corresponding margin expanding 7.6pps YoY to a record high of 17%.

Instructively, we note that FX loss previously lumped up as part of input cost was aggregated to that from revaluation of trade payables—with the latter expanding over three-fold YoY following sharp naira depreciation². That said, gains from operating performance still filtered through to bottom-line, with PBT rising 53% YoY to N3.7 billion and experiencing a first earnings growth in four years.




Figure 2: Historical PAT growth

Improved FX environment to bolster FY18 earnings

- Going into FY 18, feelers from PZ's parent suggest that its upward price adjustment would extend into coming periods as the company looks to make up for inflationary pressures. However, given the price-sensitive nature of consumers of HPC segment, we expect consumer response to translate to further trim down in volumes. In addition to this, we expect increased competition from cheaper imported substitutes to weigh on revenue from HPC and white goods segment. Consequently, we forecast FY18 revenue growth 6% higher YoY at ₩84.7 billion.
- Similarly, we expect rising crude oil prices to translate to higher costs of petrochemical inputs and leave COGS at elevated levels. Consequently, we retain gross margin at 35% with associated profit expected to come in at ₦30.6 billion

(YoY: +4%). Akin to FY 17, we expect PZ to record a modest increase in operating costs to \$15.9 billion (+ 5% YoY) on the back of management's drive to curtail expenses in light of the tough operating environment.

- Given PZ's sizable import-COGS ratio (FY 2017: 78%), the company is susceptible to sizable foreign currency losses in the near term which should impact earnings. Using the closing NAFEX rate of N359.7/\$ as a guide to naira depreciation over FY 18, we estimate FX losses of N2.5 billion. That said, associated FX losses should be 72% lower YoY in our view owing to expectations of tamer naira declines. This, in our view, will be the principal support for earnings over FY 18.
- Net impact of our model revisions translates to PBT and PAT of ¥12.3 billion (+155% YoY) and ¥8.3 billion (+126% YoY) respectively.
- PZ trades at a forward P/E of 14.2x vs. 17.5x for Bloomberg Middle East and Africa.
 We upgrade our rating on the stock to a **BUY** (vs. NEUTRAL previously) with a FVE of **N28.81**.

ARM ratings and recommendations

ARM now employs a two-tier rating system which is based on systemic importance of the security under review and the deviation of our target price for the stock from current market price. We characterize systemic importance as a function of a stock's ranking among the group of top 20 stocks by NSE market capitalization over a trailing 6 month period (minimum) to the review date. We adopt a 5 point rating system for this category of stocks and a 3 point rating system for stocks outside this group. The choice of top 20 stocks arises from the consideration that this group of stocks constitutes >75% of overall market capitalization and stocks outside this group are generally less liquid and individually account for <<1% of market capitalization. For stocks in both categories, the basis for ratings subject to target price deviation is outlined below:
