- Seplat Plc NEUTRAL (FVE: \(\text{H581.44}\)): Seplat's FY2020 numbers were reflective of the low crude demand and low oil price environment, as Liquid and Gas sales took a hit. For FY21 we expect improved liquid and gas sales as the global oil market recovers from the depressed state it was in 2020. With a full-year production guidance of 48,000bpd - 55,000bpd, we expect that Seplat will fall within guidance, whilst factors such as OPEC+ guotas limit production reaching the upper band. In addition, with a good cash balance and cost management, we expect the company to fulfill debt obligations and sustain a positive outlook.
- Guinness Nigeria Plc NEUTRAL (FVE: N28.41): The breweries sector is currently suffering from tightening margins as costs spike on the back of the currency devaluation and double-digit inflation. Guinness, which recorded a 2.2%YoY increase in revenue in the most recent quarter, might be best placed to best withstand the current malaise in the industry. They have a more diverse portfolio and are focusing more on their higher yielding spirits division which has better margins than mainstream lager where their competitors are bigger players. The decision by the industry to increase prices only serves to strengthen their case.
- **UBA STRONG BUY (FVE: N12.18):** Over 2021, we expect growth in earnings to stem from higher net interest income (+19% YoY) hinged on our expectation of a gradual recovery in interest rates. That said, we expect a slight expansion in NIM which should reflect higher asset yields. Elsewhere, we expect continuous expansion in NIR (+14% YoY), which is a reflection of our expectation of higher trading income as well as fee income. The impact of these adjustments translates to a revised PBT of N180 billion (+28% YoY). The adjustment is a 17% increase in our FVE to N12.18 (Previous: N10.39) and maintain our BUY recommendation.
- Dangsuga STRONG BUY (FVE: \(\frac{1}{2}\). Over FY20 DSR recorded an impressive 33% increase in revenue to N214.3 billion on the back of a price increase in Q320 and higher sales volume (+6.9%) over the year. Sales is expected to continue growing strongly this year as Nigeria crawls out of recession and DSR continues to reap the benefits from their completed merger with Savannah Sugar. Cost pressure from FX devaluation and double-digit inflation will continue to have an impact in 2021 but DSR have shown they know how to successfully navigate these issues and reduce the hit to their bottom line. They have reduced their FX dependency where they can and have shown a willingness to pass on higher costs to consumers.
