UAC of Nigeria Plc. | Earnings Report

Cost containment and one-off asset sales prop earnings

Last Friday, UAC of Nigeria Plc. (UACN) released its unaudited 9M 16 results wherein revenue rose 4.8% YoY to ¥57.7 billion, while UACN reported PAT of ¥4.3 billion vs a ¥75million loss in 9M 15. The 9M 16 reading is an improvement from the H1 16 results as continued cost containment and savings from finance costs combined with gains on investment disposal over Q3 16.

Cost savings and investment disposals swing earnings higher

Over Q3 16, UACN's earnings rose for the first time in seven quarters on the back of operating efficiencies and one-off gains. Notably, PBT surged three-fold YoY to ¥2.4 billion while an 83pps YoY contraction in effective taxes to 27.4% underpinned a PAT of ¥1.7 billion (Q3 15 post tax loss: ¥75 million). Over the period, UACN reported a ¥746 million profit from the sale of investment which largely underpinned a threefold YoY jump in other gains to ¥1.3 billion. Impact of the foregoing alongside absence of impairment charges (vs. ¥473 million in Q3 15) helped magnify effect of cost cutting measures over the period. In particular, UACN scaled back on its borrowings (-17.8% YoY to ¥27.2 billion) which helped temper impact of monetary tightening on finance charges (-2.7% YoY to N475 million).

This combined with effect of higher cash balance (+56.9% YoY) on interest income (+10.6% YoY) helped drive net finance cost 2.6% YoY lower to ¥475 million. Furthermore, amidst an 8.3% YoY cutback in S&D expenses which dragged OPEX-Sales ratio 1.2pps lower YoY to 13.9%, UACN reported its fastest EBIT margin expansion (+77bps YoY to 6.7%) in 15 quarters.

Price increases moderate input cost pressures

In contrast to the preceding six quarters, Q3 16 revenue jumped 20.3% YoY to N20.9 billion—8% higher than our forecast. The improved turnover largely stemmed from the food and logistics businesses as well as top-line recovery at its real estate subsidiary after six consecutive quarters of revenue declines. Sales growth at these subsidiaries more than offset weakness at the paints business (CAP: -18% YoY to N1.3 billion, Portland: +39.3% YoY to N493 million) which continues to be impacted by softer construction activities. The upswing in food turnover largely reflected higher prices. Management also attributed improved sales in the segment to improved volumes at Grand Cereals Limited (GCL) which we believe reflects recovery in livestock demand as the bird flu pandemic receded¹. At the real estate business, sales growth largely stemmed from pickup in the sale of property stock (fourfold higher YoY to N905 million) while upswing in logistics business reflected sign up of new clients.




Figure 1: Q3 16 YoY revenue growth across UACN's businesses

• As with food producers over Q3 16, UACN faced sizable input cost pressures as prices of key inputs tracked higher: flour (+34% YoY), refined sugar (+89% YoY), cereals and sorghum (more than doubled YoY). That said, relative to wider contraction at other FMCG companies thus far in Q3 16, UACN only reported a 47bps QoQ contraction in gross margin to 20.6% --(Q3 16E: 21.4%). We believe the much lower contraction reflects impact of price hikes earlier mentioned which helped UACN pass on some of the input cost inflation to customers.

Higher finance charges to weigh on Q4 earnings

- Going forward, price hikes and improved demand for livestock feed should sustain revenue growth at the food division while pickup in the sale of property stock and higher clientele base should sustain sales growth at the real estate and logistic divisions respectively. Improved turnover at these businesses should more than offset top-line weakness at the paints business which continues to be impacted by soft construction activities. Overall, we project an 18.5% YoY growth in turnover to N21.4 billion which results in FY 16E sales of N79.1 billion (+8.2% YoY).
- Following the onset of the harvest season in the quarter which should apply downward pressure on cereal and sorghum prices we see tamer input cost pressures combining with higher prices in driving 2.7pps QoQ improvement in gross margins to 23.4%.
- However, we estimate that input cost gains should be offset by higher borrowing costs (+28% YoY to N1 billion) as current monetary tightening, which has pushed naira yield curve 4.63pps higher, should result in more expensive refinancing of UACN's maturing N15.9 billion (59% of total borrowings) commercial paper debt (previously issued at 11%) in October 2016. Overall, we project a 7.6% YoY decline in Q4 16 PBT to N2.3 billion, with a lower effective tax rate (-12.1pps YoY to 32%) driving tamer fall in PAT (-2.6% YoY to N1.6 billion). Consequently, we project 2016E basic EPS to rise 15.2% to N3.09 while DPS of N1.00 should remain unchanged from prior year.
- UACN's share price has declined 10% YTD underperforming the broader NSEASI (-4.7% YTD). Currently the stock trades at a P/E of 10.4x compared to its Bloomberg Middle East and Africa Peers at 19.3x. Last trading price of ₦18.68 is at a 7% discount to our FVE of ₦20.01 which translates to a NEUTRAL rating.

ARM ratings and recommendations

ARM now employs a two-tier rating system which is based on systemic importance of the security under review and the deviation of our target price for the stock from current market price. We characterize systemic importance as a function of a stock's ranking among the group of top 20 stocks by NSE market capitalization over a trailing 6 month period (minimum) to the review date. We adopt a 5 point rating system for this category of stocks and a 3 point rating system for stocks outside this group. The choice of top 20 stocks arises from the consideration that this group of stocks constitutes >75% of overall market capitalization and stocks outside this group are generally less liquid and individually account for <<1% of market capitalization. For stocks in both categories, the basis for ratings subject to target price deviation is outlined below:
