# United Bank for Africa Plc. (UBA.NL)

#### Stock Report

### Nigeria subsidiary drags earnings lower

Yesterday, UBA released its audited H1 2020 results which came in line with our expectations. As expected, weak earnings in the Nigerian subsidiary weighed on the group's earning over the period. Precisely, PAT for the Nigeria operation declined by 47.6% YoY over H1 2020. Meanwhile, PAT for the rest of Africa segment expanded by 46% YoY. Consequently, the group's PAT declined by 21.7% YoY to ¥44.4 billion. Despite the lower earnings, UBA declared an interim dividend of ¥0.17/share, albeit lower than ¥0.20/share declared in same period last year. We have left most of our estimates unchanged save for the potential impact of the revised savings deposit rate on interest expense. That said, we still expect UBA to record lower PAT of ¥83.8 billion (-6% YoY) over FY 2020. Our FVE of ¥10.0/share (previously ¥8.5/share) translates to a BUY rating on the stock based on current pricing. Meanwhile, we continue to favour GTB and Zenith given their adequate buffers to withstand the prevailing pressures. Particularly, both banks continue to command better ROEs than their peers.

- The major drag to earnings over the period was a 20.6% YoY increase in operating expense reflecting higher AMCON levy, premises maintenance costs, contract services and personnel cost. The increase in opex came as a surprise to us as we had expected the lockdown in previous months to help drive costs lower. Consequently, cost to income ratio expanded by 717 bps YoY to 67.2%. Elsewhere, loan loss provisioning expanded by 150% YoY on the back of covid-19 related pressures on loan sectors. This translated to a higher cost of risk of 0.7% (+34 bps YoY) over H1 2020.
- Net Interest Margin (-73 bps YoY) remained pressured owing to faster decline in asset yield. Meanwhile, reflecting a decline in interest expense (-9% YoY), Net Interest Income expanded moderately by 8.4% YoY. Also, NIR expanded by 6.7% YoY supported by increases in fee income, FX revaluation gain and gains on derivatives.
- Over Q2 2020 stand alone, PBT and PAT moderated by 25.4% QoQ and 52.4% QoQ.
  The faster decline in PAT reflected a higher effective tax over the period.

- That said, impact of covid-19 and lower rate environment weighed on interest income (-11.6% QoQ) over the period. This overshadowed moderation in interest expense (-2.6% QoQ). On balance, NII declined by 17.6% QoQ.
- Similar with H1 20, loan loss provision expanded by 96% QoQ while opex increased by 25% QoQ largely due to AMCON levy booked in Q2 20, increase in premises maintenance costs and contract services. NIR expanded by 71.3% QoQ bucking the trend. Drivers for this were FX revaluation gains and derivative gains.
- With the results in line with our estimates, we have left most of our estimates unchanged save for the potential impact of the reduction in savings deposit rate. We expect a potential reduction of \$5.2 billion in interest expense in FY 2020. That said, we still expect UBA to record lower PAT of \$83.8 billion (-6% YoY) over FY 2020. Our FVE of \$10.0/share (previously \$8.5/share) translates to a BUY rating on the stock based on current pricing. Meanwhile, we continue to favour GTB and Zenith given their adequate buffers to withstand the prevailing pressures. Particularly, both banks continue to command better ROEs than their peers.

#### **ARM ratings and recommendations**

ARM now employs a two-tier rating system which is based on systemic importance of the security under review and the deviation of our target price for the stock from current market price. We characterize systemic importance as a function of a stock's ranking among the group of top 20 stocks by NSE market capitalization over a trailing 6-month period (minimum) to the review date. We adopt a 5-point rating system for this category of stocks and a 3-point rating system for stocks outside this group. The choice of top 20 stocks arises from the consideration that this group of stocks constitutes >75% of overall market capitalization and stocks outside this group are generally less liquid and individually account for <<1% of market capitalization. For stocks in both categories, the basis for ratings subject to target price deviation is outlined below:
