Stock Report

Revenue drops, technical devaluation to further pressure FY 20 earnings

- Unilever released its Q1 2020 financial result on Friday, revealing a 30.7% YoY decline in revenue. PBT declined by 53.2% YoY, while PAT only declined by 26.7% to N1.14 billion with EPS at N0.19 which we believe reflects the tax loss carried forward worth N166 million. Specifically, average tax rate applied over the review period is 15% (vs. quarterly average of 24% in 2019).
- Period declined YoY but improved QoQ: As stated earlier, sales over the review period declined to \$\frac{\text{N}}{13.3}\$ billion, stemming from both the food and HPC segment. Food declined by 19.9% YoY while the personal care segment declined by 40.7% YoY. However, QoQ sales improved by 50.5%, which we believe is positive for the company given the consistent decline since Q2 19 when the company decided to clamp down on its receivables. Interestingly, receivables was relatively flat at \$\frac{\text{N}}{24.6}\$ billion, compared to the FY 19. Another positive thing about the result is the expansion in gross margin by 560bps YoY to 25.7% mirroring a faster decline in input cost. Notwithstanding, increased overheads and marketing expenses led to a 342 bps YoY decline in PBT margin to 7.1%.
- Elsewhere, the company reported positive cash flow from operations, printing at №4.68 billion from a negative position reported as at FY19, due to an increase in its trade payables.
- earnings: Over 2020, we retain our expectation of a decline in sales given the disruption to production in Q2 coupled with continued competition within the industry being key drivers. Consequently, we expect revenue to drop by 30% to \$\frac{1}{2}\$42.3 billion. In addition, the technical devaluation implemented in March with applicable exchange rate now at the SMIS window now at \$\frac{1}{2}\$380.9/\$ (previously: \$\frac{1}{2}\$358.5/\$) is expected to increase the company's input cost. On that note, we expect the company to report an operating loss of \$\frac{1}{2}\$9.8 billion, while the finance income will help in reducing the loss before tax to \$\frac{1}{2}\$8.1 billion (FY 19: \$\frac{1}{2}\$9.8 billion). Upside to our estimate will be the company's ability to pass on the cost to final consumers which we are yet to include in our model.

On our expectation of a further decline in sales and pressure on cost, we retain our FVE of ₹12.71. Relative to the last closing price, it presents a 15.5% upside and translates to **NEUTRAL** rating. Despite the upside, we see no room for a re-rating in the stock this year given that we still expect the company to report a loss in 2020.

ARM ratings and recommendations

ARM now employs a two-tier rating system which is based on systemic importance of the security under review and the deviation of our target price for the stock from current market price. We characterize systemic importance as a function of a stock's ranking among the group of top 20 stocks by NSE market capitalization over a trailing 6-month period (minimum) to the review date. We adopt a 5-point rating system for this category of stocks and a 3-point rating system for stocks outside this group. The choice of top 20 stocks arises from the consideration that this group of stocks constitutes >75% of overall market capitalization and stocks outside this group are generally less liquid and individually account for <<1% of market capitalization. For stocks in both categories, the basis for ratings subject to target price deviation is outlined below:
