- Dangote Cement Plc – STRONG BUY (FVE: ₦240.87):** The tough competitive play in 2019 placed pressure on DANGCEM’s FY 19 earnings, with EPS printing 21% lower to ₦11.8 (ex-tax credit impact). While competition is likely to continue playing out in 2020 pressuring domestic market, we expect recovery in exports from the Nigeria business, as the export terminal is set for completion in H1 20. This is expected to neuter negative impact of the border closure in 2019. We also expect positive contribution from the Pan-African businesses. Finally, shareholders stand to enjoy the attractive ₦16 dividend per share, yielding ~12% on current pricing, as well as value accretion from the planned share buy-back programme.
- Nestle Plc – STRONG BUY (FVE: ₦1447.39):** This year, incessant competition in the seasoning market informs relative stability in prices, particularly in the food segment. However, we believe the brand loyalty enjoyed thus far, lower seasoning price relative to the closest peer “Knorr” as well as modest growth in the beverage segment will keep sales afloat. Also, efficient cost management, low exposure to foreign debt and tax rate normalization informs our FY 20 EPS estimate of ₦69.12 (+19.9% YoY) and FVE of N1,447.39 which translates to a BUY rating.
- GTB – STRONG BUY (FVE: ₦37.0):** Amid heightened regulatory overhang, impact of covid-19 pandemic on economic activities and lower oil price, we like GTB given its impressive Cost to Income ratio relative to peers as well as proven strategies. Also, with a CAR of 22.5%; on a stress test, GTB would still be in a good position assuming Cost or Risk go as high as 10% (FY 19: 0.3%). We also see GTB’s plan of a Holdco as positive given that the current CEO (Segun Agbaje) would retain the helm of affairs thus ensuring a continuation of growth strategy in the group. Lastly, possible moves into the asset management business and payments services sector would offer a diversification away from the heightened regulations in core banking.
- UBA – STRONG BUY (FVE: ₦13.04):** We expect to see additional contribution to UBA’s PBT from its rest of Africa business, which could reduce impact of the regulatory overhang in the Nigeria business. In addition, we see the recent retail strategy as positive to the bank, as this should help reduce funding cost for the bank.
