## **UNITED BANK FOR AFRICA Plc. (UBA.Plc)**

### **Stock Report**

### Positive Outing Buoyed by Interest and Non-Interest Income Growth

- Gross earnings grew 18.3% YoY to ₩184.3bn on the back of interest and non-interest income growth, slightly exceeding our Q122 estimates. Interest income grew 15.2% to ₩125.1bn in Q1, driven majorly by a 73% surge in income from bonds to ₦33.1bn from ₦19.1bn. This correlates with the improved (101.9%) investment in bonds to N1.5tn from N718.5tn. Similarly, the firm grew Income on customer loans by 5.4% to ₦70bn, an offshoot of the expansion (5.0% YoY) in loans made to customers.
- Interest expense advanced (17.5% YoY) to ¥40.2bn on the back of a 61.5% increase in interest on customer deposits to ¥30bn from ¥19bn. This aligns with the increase (4.5%) in total deposits despite an increase in the proportion of CASA deposits from 82.6% to 85.5%. Thus, annualized cost of funds inched higher by 8bps to 2.1% in Q122. Net Interest Income, therefore, increased by 14.1% to ¥84.9bn.
- On the Non-Interest Revenue leg, income rose 25.3% to N59.2bn on the back of growth in Fee & Commission income, and trading & FX income. Fee and commission echoed growth in E-banking income (+21%), trade transaction income (109.2%), and credit-related fees and commissions (+40.9%), rising 20.4% to N42.1bn. Income from fixed income and foreign exchange trading also aided non-interest revenue with a 42.9% increase to N15.0bn. This development reiterates the experience across the tier 1 banks with income from E-banking and other transactions as well as trading enhancing topline performance.
- OPEX increased 20.5% to #77.6bn as personnel-related costs spiked 20% to #25.6bn. Similarly, the increase in diesel prices reflected in higher fuels, repairs, and maintenance expenses (+28% to #8.6bn). These pushed cost-to-income ratio to 61.7% in Q122 from 60.4% in Q121.

- UBA recorded improved profitability with Profit before Tax up 9.6% to ₩44.5bn and Profit after Tax up 8.8% to ₩41.5bn. In this light, annualized Return on Equity inched marginally higher to 20.1% from 20.0% in Q121 while Return on Assets remained at 1.9% in Q122 (same as in Q121).
- For FY 2022, we expect this performance to be sustained upon higher loan growth relative to 2021 and expectations of higher yields in the Fixed Income market. Non-Interest Revenue should also reverberate the lender's digital banking drive which is important in its bid to capture a big demography of young people. We see a target price of ₦10.80 for UBA, representing a 34.1% upside compared to its close price of ₦8.05 and hence, we rate UBA a STRONG BUY.

#### **ARM ratings and recommendations**

ARM now employs a two-tier rating system which is based on systemic importance of the security under review and the deviation of our target price for the stock from current market price. We characterize systemic importance as a function of a stock's ranking among the group of top 20 stocks by NSE market capitalization over a trailing 6-month period (minimum) to the review date. We adopt a 5-point rating system for this category of stocks and a 3-point rating system for stocks outside this group. The choice of top 20 stocks arises from the consideration that this group of stocks constitutes >75% of overall market capitalization and stocks outside this group are generally less liquid and individually account for <<1% of market capitalization. For stocks in both categories, the basis for ratings subject to target price deviation is outlined below:
