Weekly Commentary & Stock recommendation

Global Economy

According to initial estimates, the Eurozone economy shrank by 5.1%YoY in Q420, bringing FY20's decline to 6.8% which reflects the negative impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. The quarterly decline was less than analysts' forecast (-5.4%YoY) and came following better-than-expected GDP performances in Germany (-3.9%YoY vs -4%YoY), Italy (-6.6%YoY vs -6.7%YoY) and Spain (-9.1%YoY vs -10.8%YoY). Still in the EU, preliminary estimate revealed that annual inflation rate jumped to 0.9%YoY in January (December: -0.3%YoY), ending a 5-month sequence of deflation. The surge is partly attributable to a Jan 1st reversal in a VAT rate cut (from 16% back to 19%) which was introduced as part of the German government's stimulus package in H2'20. Additionally, upward pressures were seen in the prices of food, alcohol & tobacco (up 1.5%YoY vs 1.3%YoY in December 2020) and services (up 1.4%YoY vs 0.7%YoY in December 2020), while the cost of energy is expected to decline at a slower rate (-4.1%YoY vs -6.9%YoY). Finally, in the UK, the BOE's Monetary Policy Committee voted unanimously to retain its benchmark interest rate at 0.1% while also maintaining the size of its Total Asset Purchase Programme at £895billion during its February meeting. Policy makers also sounded out optimism with regards to improved economic outlook following the roll-out of COVID vaccines across the world but remained concerned about the re-imposition of restrictive measures amid an uptick in infection rates.

Domestic Economy

Data released this week showed capital importation into Nigeria declined by 60% YoY to \$9.68 billion (FY 2019: \$23.9 billion). Precisely, Foreign Portfolio Investment (FPI) declined by 69% YoY to \$5.2 billion (FY 19: \$16.4 billion) while other investment which comprises trade credits, loans, currency deposits and other claims, moderated by 47% YoY to \$6.7 billion. On the other hand, Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) rose by 10% YoY to \$1.03 billion over FY 2020 (FY 19: \$934.3 million). Over Q4 2020, total capital importation shrank 26.8% QoQ to \$666.3 million. FDI and FPI contracted by 39.4% QoQ and 91.3% QoQ, to \$251.3 million and \$35.2 million respectively. Meanwhile, other investment rose by 22.5% QoQ to \$783.3 million. Elsewhere, the federal government in collaboration with the world bank have kickoff the process to rebase Nigeria's GDP. For clarity, this process involves replacing the old base year used to compile volume measures of GDP, with an updated base year, in order to help reflect the current state of activities in each sector.

Equities and stock recommendation

- The Nigerian bourse returned to the negative terrain this week, as NSE ASI edged down 166bps WoW to settle at 41,709.09points, with market cap printing at N21.8 trillion. Losses recorded across Construction (-7.59%), Food (-3.77%) Breweries (-3.10%), Banking (-2.03%) and Cement (-1.72%) WoW eclipsed gains posted in the Personal Care (+4.78%) sector. Taking a further delve into the sectoral performances, we saw selloffs in DANGCEM (-2.54%), NESTLE (-3.65%), NB (-3.17%), ZENITH (-4.41%), JBERGER (-13.02%) and WAPCO (-11.17%) WoW lead the downturn. Conversely, ETERNA (+10.58%), UNILE-VER (+8.15%), GUARANTY (+4.35%) and INTBREW (+3.33%) ended the week positive.

Fixed Income

At the OMO auction this week, there was a surprising rise in the average stop rate by 467bps to 8.53%. The 1yr bill sold at 10.10% which is the first time its been sold at a double-digit rate since April 2020. In the secondary market, the average fixed income yield ended the week 4bps lower to 4.21% on the back of declines at both ends of the curve. To shed more light, downticks in the Mar-2036 (-42bps), Feb-2028 (-35bps) and Apr-2037 (-27bps) papers led the average bond yield down 7bps WoW to 7.38% while the average NTB yield shed 2bps WoW to 1.03%, owing largely to downward pressures in the 270-day (-28bps) and 91-day (-3bps) bills.



Q420 Capital Importation

This week, we feature Nigeria's Q4'20 total capital importation numbers, which continued to reflect foreign investors' current negative sentiment towards the Nigerian economy. Speaking to numbers, total capital importation declined by 26.8% QoQ and 71.9% YoY to \$1.07 billion. The major drag was a consequence of the significant drop in foreign portfolio inflows (-91.4% QoQ and -98.1% YoY to \$35.15 million), with other components also registering YoY decline. Uncertainty in the macroeconomic landscape and unattractive yields in the fixed income space has continued to adversely impact foreign inflows for Nigeria. Similar to the previous two quarters, Other investment inflows, remained the largest component of the total capital imported in Q4'20 (contributing 73.2% to the overall bucket). Over the FY20 period, total capital inflow to Nigeria shrank by 59.7% YoY to print \$9.68 billion. This is following the 68.6% YoY reduction in FPI and 47.5% YoY reduction in Other investment. They thus closed at \$5.14 billion and \$3.51 billion respectively, and this more than offset the 10.1% YoY improvement in FDI to \$1.03 billion.
