## Weekly Commentary & Stock Recommendation

#### Global Economy

♦ In the UK, unemployment rate edged up marginally to 5% in November 2020 (October 2020: 4.9%), its highest level since early 2016 but below market expectations of 5.1%. This was the fifth consecutive monthly increase in the jobless rate as the nation's labor market continued to reel from the harsh effects of the coronavirus pandemic. According to the first advance estimate released by the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA), economic growth in the US slowed to 4%QoQ in Q420 (Q3'20: 33.4%QoQ). The expansion reflects upticks in exports(+22.0%QoQ), Gross fixed investment (+18.4%QoQ) and Personal Consumption Expenditure (+2.5%QoQ), although these were partly offset by a decline in State and Federal government spending (-1.2%QoQ). Over FY20, GDP contracted by 3.5% (FY19: 2.2%), its worst performance posted this century. Meanwhile, the Fed left the target range for its federal funds rate at 0-0.25%, while also maintaining its QE program for Treasuries and Mortgage-Backed Securities at \$80 billion and \$40 billion respectively. Furthermore, policy makers reiterated their commitment to using the bank's full range of tools to provide further support to an already strained economy

#### Domestic Economy

♦ At the first Monetary policy meeting of the year, the MPC voted to retain MPR at 11.5%, leaving all other parameters unchanged, citing the need to mitigate the impact of the pandemic on the economy. Elsewhere, the IMF revised its growth forecast for Nigeria to 1.5% over FY 2021 (Previously 1.7%) as renewed waves and new variants of the virus poses concerns for the outlook. Meanwhile, recently published data from the NBS showed a 10% YoY uptick in Non-oil revenue to №2.94 trillion over FY 2020. Precisely, the expansion in Non-oil revenue stemmed from a 29% YoY increase in value added tax (VAT) to №1.53 trillion - a fallout of higher VAT to 7.5% (previously 5%) implemented in 2020. Meanwhile company income tax (CIT) moderated by 6% YoY to №1.41 trillion, which we believe is not unrelated to lower corporate earnings due to the adverse impact on the pandemic during the period.

#### Equities and stock recommendation

- ♦ The downturn in the Nigerian bourse was short-lived, as NSE ASI rose 344bps WoW to settle at 42,412.66 points, while market cap came in at №22.2 trillion. Save for the Oil&Gas sector which lost 14.93% WoW, all other sectors posted gains, with Construction (+10.69%), Telecom (+7.92%) Breweries (+4.30%) and Banking (+3.05%) at the vanguard of the gains. Dissecting the sectoral performances further revealed that JBERGER (+19.84%), WAPCO (+15.38%), AIRTEL (+9.18%), MTNN (+6.47%), FLOURMILL (+8.44%), GUARANTY (+4.23%), ZENITH (+2.64%) and NB (+3.28%) WoW were the prime drivers for the upturn. Meanwhile, weekly declines were recorded across SEPLAT (-9.26%), MOBIL (-8.62%) ARDOVA (-8.62%) and INTBREW (-8.95%).

#### Fixed Income

♦ At this week's NTB auction, №181.98 billion was sold which was less than the №187.30 billion that was offered and that matured. This means that the DMO is yet to rollover at either of the NTB auctions so far this year. The average stop rate, meanwhile, continued to rise as it gained 28bps at the last auction to close at 1.28%. While at the OMO auction, the CBN sold №145billion (vs №190 billion maturing) with the average stop rate remaining unchanged at 3.86%. In the secondary market, the average fixed income yield printed 76bps higher WoW to 4.25% mirroring increases at both ends of the curve. For context, the average bond yield edged up 99bps WoW to 7.45% following increases in the Apr-2023 (+241bps), Mar-2024 (+190bps) and Apr-2037 (+152bps) instruments while the average NTB yield rose by 53bp WoW to 1.05%, spurred by a rise across the 270-day (+104bps) and 182-day (+53bps) bills.





## Weekly Commentary & Stock Recommendation

### December performance of the NSE

In December 2020, total value traded on the Nigeria Stock Exchange declined by 15.28% MoM to N269.24 billion. The reduction was driven by a decrease in activities from Domestic investors, which fell by 20.43% MoM while we saw an improvement in Foreign participation over the same period. However, Domestic investors continued to dominate activities on the stock exchange with a participation rate of 74.03% in December 2020. Over the FY20 period, total value traded on the local bourse increased by 12.20% to N2.17 trillion with a higher participation rate from Domestic investors (66.37%) compared to Foreign investors (33.63%).
