Weekly Commentary & Stock Recommendation

Global Economy

♦ The Eurozone's annual inflation rate was down 1bp in September, printing at -0.3%YoY (August: -0.2%), in line with a preliminary estimate. This decline was anchored by falls in services inflation (0.7% to 0.5%), non-energy industrial goods (-0.1% to -0.3%) and the cost of energy products (-7.8% to -8.2%). In the US, annual inflation rate edged up marginally by 1bp to 1.4%YoY in September (August: 1.3%). This resulted from a 30bps rise in the cost of new vehicles to 1.0% (August: 0.7%), while cost of medical care commodities was also up 10bps to 0.9% (from 0.8%). Elsewhere, annual inflation in China for September declined by 70bps, easing to a 19-month low of 1.7%YoY (August: 2.4%), amid a substantial slowdown in food prices to 7.9% (from 11.2% in August).

Domestic Economy

♦ Headline inflation for the month of September increased for the seventh consecutive month by 47bps to 13.71% YoY spurred by increases in both food and core inflation. Food inflation significantly rose 64bps to 16.65% YoY reflecting flooding in localized areas in the North, precisely in Kebbi and Niger state, as well as the extended lean season, according to FEWSNET. Consequently, farm produce ticked 92bps higher to 17.29% YoY, outweighing moderations in imported (-1bp to 16.43% YoY) and processed (-230bps to 9.9% YoY) food inflation. Meanwhile, core inflation rose 9bps to 10.59% YoY, reflecting uptick in HWEGF (+16bps), Health (+50bps), Transport (+44bps), Furnishing (+23bps), Clothing (+20bps), amongst other core sub-indices. Similarly, MoM head-line inflation rose 11bps to 1.46% owing to increase in food inflation by 18bps to 1.86% MoM, while core inflation declined 7bps to 0.97% MoM. Elsewhere, the IMF now forecasts a less severe contraction of 4.3% FY 2020 (previously: -5.4%) for Nigeria's GDP, before a recovery of 1.7% in 2021. The IMF cited stronger-than-anticipated GDP outturns in Q2 20.

Equities and stock recommendation

- ◆ Activities in the Nigerian bourse closed on a positive note for the fourth consecutive week, as the NSE ASI appreciated by 86bpsWoW to close at 28,659.45points, while market cap ended the week at №14.98 trillion. With the exception of the Cement, Telecom and Insurance which lost 24bps, 23bps and 117bps respectively, all other sectors recorded gains with Oil & Gas (+7.01%), Banking (+2.70%) and Breweries (+2.20%) at the forefront of the gains. A dive into the sectoral performance revealed the major drivers for the upside were ETERNA (+34.99%), INTBREW (+12.92%), GUINNESS (+12.33%), WAPCO (+10.88%) and TOTAL (+10.00%) WoW. On the other hand, declines were observed in MANSARD (-5.67%), BUACEMENT (-1.45%), GLAXOSMITH (-3.45%) and GUARANTY (-0.16%) WoW amongst others.

Fixed Income

Average fixed income yields closed the week 67bps lower at 2.85%, marking a new low for yields as they fell below 3% for the first time in over 7years based on our records. The average bond yield dropped 103bps WoW to 4.59% while the average NTB was 32bps lower at 1.12%. In the primary market, the DMO offered and sold N124.88 billion at the NTB auction which matches the amount that matured. Total subscription printed at N618.09 billion, resulting in a subscription rate of 4.95x – the highest rate since June. The average stop rate, however, declined for the fourth straight auction by 46bps to 1.33%. Finally, the DMO released their offer for October's bond auction and it showed a total offering of N30 billion which is considerably less than the approx. N140 billion they offered on average at the 3 auctions in held in Q320.




