Weekly Commentary & Stock recommendation

...for the week 28th March - 1st April 2022

Global Economy

- ◆ At the end of the first quarter of the year, the global market had witnessed high volatility as the world was still recovering from the impacts of the Covid-19 pandemic, the Russia-Ukraine conflict further amplified the issue as crude oil prices recorded a huge rise at the beginning of the year following hampered supply of crude oil due to the conflict. Sanctions on Russia also caused instability and tensions in the market. While the Russian army seems to be withdrawing from Kyiv and engaging in peace talks, the United States warned that this seems to be more of a strategy to regroup and re-strategize, as they have not been able to conquer Kyiv and other major cities in Ukraine. The US two-year and ten-year treasury bond yields declined 0.03 bps before bouncing back to 5bps. This inversion was termed by analysts as a signal for economic recession as the market reacts to the FEDs decision to hike rates in a bid to tackle high inflation. Elsewhere, the Covid outbreak in China continues to impede economic activities as more companies planning IPOs have suspended their action and a lockdown is being observed in major cities such as Shanghai. With the Russia-Ukraine peace negotiations to resume today, we opine that the outcome of this meeting will be a major driver of the global market in the coming weeks.

Domestic Economy

- ◆ During the week, the Abuja-Kaduna railway line was the guest of the festering insecurities, one of the many factors that has plagued Nigeria and encumbered investment inflow in recent years. Casualties were recorded with efforts now been touted to ensure a more secured rail track across the Nation. Recall, there had been similar issues in the past along that track, with the recent development leaving further dent on the hope and aspirations of the nation to attract the much need capital inflow. In the words of the Minister of Transportation, one of the measures that could have provided some heads up about the attack was held back by the bureaucracy in the procurement process, another of the factors that enshrines a difficult business environment in the country. In other news, the 27th OPEC and non-OPEC Ministerial Meeting held yesterday, where there was a decision to adjust upward the monthly overall production by 0.432mb/d for the month of May 2022. Although, Nigeria has not been able to meet up with its April 2022 production quota of 1.735 million barrels per day, the Organization raised Nigeria's oil production quota to a new target of 1.753 million barrels per day for May 2022. Earlier this month, the Monetary Policy Committee, in its MPC meeting, had alluded the shortage in supply of petroleum products to the aberrant rate of oil theft experienced in the country. The Nigerian Government and the NNPC will need to take immediate steps to curb the ongoing theft, to ensure we have a clear view of its oil production capacity and to improve foreign exchange.

Equities and stock recommendation

- ◆ The Nigerian Equities Market ended the week on a negative note as it shed 0.26% to have a closing NGX All Share Index of 46,842.86pts. The performance was majorly impacted by profit-taking activities across major counters that have recorded significant traction in the previous weeks. On a sectoral basis, it was an overarching outturn evidenced by the fact that all sectors under our Watch closed in the negative territory. Despite the all-encompassing negative sentiment, MEYER (Up 30.9% YtD), JOHNHOLT (Up 19.4% WtD), CORNERSTONE (Up 13.8% WtD), and PZ (Up 13.4% WtD) were able to lead the gainers chart for the week. On the other hand, we recorded bearish sentiments on many tickers, with CHIPLC (Down -25.4% WtD), LINKASSURE (Down -20.6% WtD), BERGER (Down -18.0% WtD), and ZENITHBANK (Down -16.7% WtD) headlining the list.

Fixed Income

- ◆ Average yields in the Nigerian Treasury Bills secondary market inched higher by 6bps to close at 3.29% due to sell-offs at the long-end in line with higher rate at the auction. At the Treasury Bills auction on Wednesday, we saw an uptick in the average marginal rate to 3.07% from 2.91% at the last auction. Specifically, the rate on the 364-day bill rose 45bps to 4.45% due to relatively low demand compared to the remaining two bills. Bid to cover ratio at the auction was 1.73x with demand of ₦247.6bn compared to offer of ₦143.3bn. However, we saw massive demand at the 182-day instrument with bid-to-cover

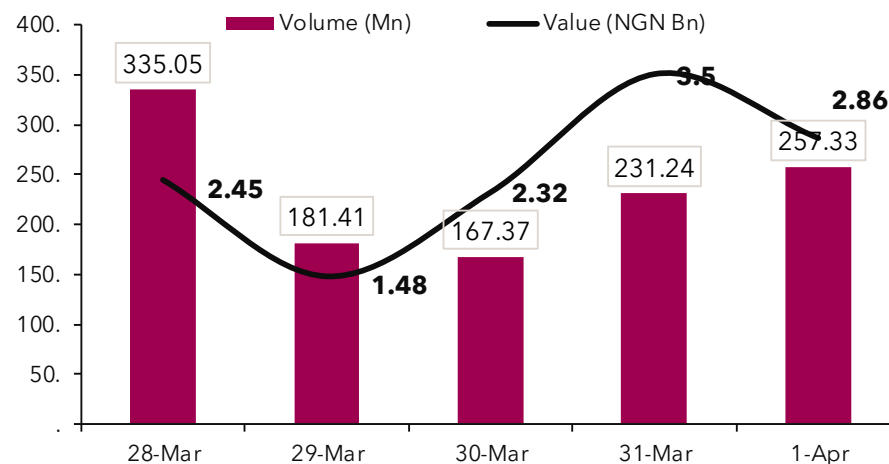

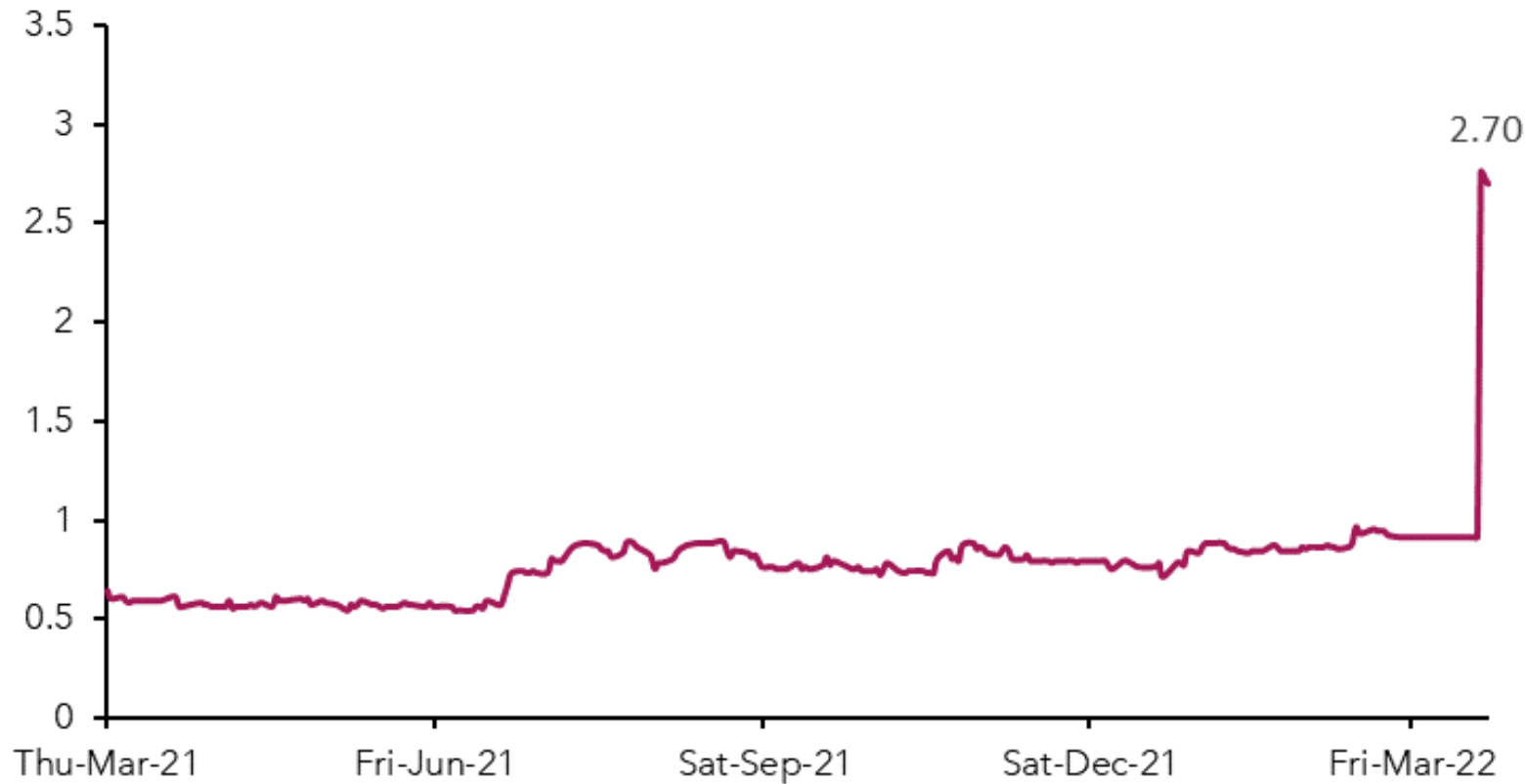
